In Ontario, a significant development was announced an expansion in the range of medical conditions for which pharmacists could prescribe treatments. This move aimed to increase healthcare accessibility and efficiency across the province. Emily della Bello, a registered nurse said it benefits patients because they spend less time waiting for their prescriptions and they don't need to make appointments to go to walk in clinics to see a doctor. Her insights shed light on the immediate advantage this expansion would bring eliminating the need for intermediaries and allowing those in need for treatment to receive their medication more promptly. The official announcement came during a Sunday press conference hosted by the

Health Minister Sylvia Jones. The plan marked a significant addition to the health care services. The province introduced six additional health conditions to the list, acne, yeast infections, canker sores, diaper rash, parasitic worms and nausea and vomiting and pregnancy. sistex from the Ontario Ministry of Health indicate that 89% of pharmacies in Ontario had already begun treating health issues since gaining prescription privileges at the start of the year.
