Ontario introduced a bill that will require employers to list salaries and job postings. The Ford government says the bill is designed to increase pay transparency, and help job seekers make informed decisions. It's also aimed at reducing the gender pay gap. Canada is lagging far behind its neighbor to the south when it comes to economic growth. Both the US and Canadian economy show strong employment figures. But while the US economy is growing by 4.9%, Canada is on the brink of a recession. Economists say the biggest reason why the American economy is growing faster is higher consumer spending. Canadians are spending less because higher interest rates have hit them harder. Most Canadians have short term

mortgages compared to their US neighbors. As a result, they're saving more to prepare for mortgage renewal. Though this might sound like responsible spending, it's a recipe for recession.

After over six weeks, the trial of former Canadian fashion mogul Peter Nygaard is coming to an end. Final arguments from both crown prosecutors and the defense were heard on Tuesday and jury deliberations began Wednesday. Night Guard is facing charges of five counts of sexual assault and one count of forcible confinement. He has pled guilty to all charges or pled not guilty to all charges. Quebec's announcement to double tuition for out of province students could be even worse for non research based graduate students who are already paying as much as 22,000 for degrees like an MBA. The tuition hikes announced by Quebec premier Francois Legault would see some graduate students pay several \$1,000 more in tuition. Meanwhile, undergraduate students from outside the province are expected to pay roughly 17,000 per year, instead of the current price of just over 8000. The impact on future students including Tmu graduates can be significant considering that master's program enrollment in Canada has increased steadily in the past 10 years. According to a 2021 report from statistics. The tuition hikes could present an opportunity for Canadian schools outside Quebec, like TMU's to attract students who might otherwise have applied to study in the Francophone province. When asked how the new policy might impact TMU's enrollment figures TMU's said they are not commenting at this time.

Holocaust education week kicked off with the photo exhibition displayed in the Student Learning Center on Monday and Tuesday. The display titled the unknowable, untold stories of the Holocaust features images of artifacts, including personal writings and records of survivors, a photo of Jewish Canadian sending parcels to Poland circa 1939 to 45 and a letter from Pierre Elliot Trudeau in 1967. For survivors about Canadian hate speech laws, the photos were curated by the Toronto Holocaust Museum. Their photo exhibition is part of the wider Holocaust education week initiative at Tmu, which was first held in 2017. The week is organized in collaboration with the University and the Toronto metropolitan Students Union.

A City of Toronto proposal to build affordable housing units at 405. Sherbourne Street is being welcomed by local community members. The proposal was announced as part of 22 recommendations to address Toronto's housing crisis released in late October. The recommendations came before the City of Toronto executive committee for consideration on October 31, and 2021. The city rezone the property, which currently serves as a parking lot to provide at least 267 rent controlled homes, a third of which is earmarked for affordable housing.
