A new report from the Toronto Foundation found that the city is one of the loneliest places in Canada, with 37% of adults saying they feel lonely at least three days a week. This makes Toronto adults lonelier than those in any other major Canadian city. The study found that many Toronto residents reported high levels of anxiety and depression 50% of adults say they feel depressed at least one day a week will 22% of workers feel burnt out most or all of the time.

A recent Statistics Canada study revealed that nearly 7 million Canadians struggled with hunger last year. And amid rising inflation some even went days without food, and 2020 to 18% of Canadian families reported experiencing food insecurity within the last 12 months. This is an increase from 16% and 2021. Food insecurity which is defined as the lack of a sufficient amount of food or quality of diet was found to be more prominent and racialized families.

Just like you know, if you take your dog off leash, you get a very different dog than the one that's sitting on your on your couch, as much as we want them to be our little furry babies. They're their own creatures, when we bring them out. It's the kind of a way that we share. We're sharing these wild spaces with them. And these places are very important, you would assume our parts are protected, but I just never know. And I kind of want to document and commemorate these spaces while they're here. A huge part of my job is taking dogs to these parks, and I've gotten to know them

very well. And I just kind of wanted to show people what I saw when I see these places. Again, it's a way of kind of expressing how important these places are to me and trying to package it so that other people can see that too.
