Toronto metropolitan university is asking community members to read and provide feedback on phase two of its sexual violence policy review. That feedback will be gathered in an online survey that will be up until March 1, according to a statement sent out to the team you community on Monday. The online survey is an anonymous nine page Google form asking the user to go through specific policy sections and give general feedback on language and section descriptions. In Phase one's announcement, the university stated they're available helped maintain our commitment to excellence and fairness of process and will ensure that the policy continues to reflect an institutional commitment to addressing sexual violence and promoting a culture of consent and a trauma informed way. This is a regular review process required by the Ministry of colleges and universities every three years. The policy covers complaint procedures, education strategies, support for people affected by sexual violence and more. A few of the proposed changes include 14 new definitions ranging from online and relationship violence to when it's classified as a complaint. A new section on values and guiding principles covering how the policy aligned to the university equity, diversity, accountability and employee relationships, schools zones, other TMU's offices and affiliated groups were added alongside faculties and departments of spaces that should include related education where appropriate parameters of consent are flushed out and a new parameter of relationship Harkey, but the new university was added workplace well being services was added as a support option. Alongside consent comes first applications and scope expanded the definition of off campus to include places such as online spaces principles governing approach added additional information on trauma informed approaches, support and questions about sexual expression. Part three was added to focus more on the procedures of the complaint resolution process. students at Toronto metropolitan university say they're willing to take the good with the bad after a study was released by the University of Ottawa earlier this month, linking cannabis usage to incidents of anxiety and anxiety disorders. The study contained over 12 million participants who had not previously received medical treatment for anxiety disorders. Over 30,000 of these participants had their first visit to the emergency department due to cannabis induced anxiety within three years of the study, which began in 2019. Elisa Montero a fourth year student at TMU's, who struggles with anxiety and has been prescribed medication for it in the past said that while she had anxiety brought on by cannabis, she also benefited from using it by come home have a bit of a smoke. And suddenly I feel like all of the intrusive anxious thoughts are kind of put on the backburner. Second year student unes Park had a similar experience. It's not really affected my anxiety levels to the point where I felt like I personally need to stop.

Because I've been experiencing we're experiencing anxiety for a few years now. And most of those years I haven't used to be it at all. Dr. Bernard Laval, a senior scientist specializing in addiction at CAMH caution against cannabis usage in young adults. It is best for young people to abstain from cannabis, as early initiation is associated with increased risk of developing subsequent cannabis use disorder. It seems also that exposure to cannabis may create or worsen some psychiatric issues in some individuals. When asked if close proximity of cannabis shops to the school campus might factor into higher usage for the TMU's student population. Laval couldn't comment. But in a similar study released last month, poor mental health outcomes in young adults were also linked to the consumption of energy drinks. Laval urges consumers to be aware of the uncertainty of potential consequences of cannabis usage. There is for sure a risk related to acute intoxication and also some acute psychiatric consequences.
