The Canadian union of public employees says Academy workers cannot cope with the rising cost of groceries and housing with their existing wages.

Since the gamification of online gambling, Ontario has seen a sharp incline in the rate of youth participation. In response, this ban is expected to combat the spike by reducing the number of ads targeting minors and other people who may be at risk.

Starting today, a new bylaw comes into effect in Toronto to reduce single use plastics. Businesses will now ask if you need single use items like cutlery straws and napkins before giving them out. If consumers want to use reusable shopping bags or cups, businesses will have to accept them. If they fail to comply. They could be fine from \$500 up to \$100,000. Bill 64 was also passed last December by the Toronto City Council to reduce waste and promote reusable alternatives.
