Opposition party leaders have spoken out about the decision, with Green Party Leader Mike Schreiner claiming it is a massive distraction, and LCBO spokesperson said they will share more details with consumers in the coming weeks.

To meet the target of building 1.5 million homes in 10 years, Ontario is considering to include student housing in the tally. This intention was confirmed in a letter the Ontario government sent to the city of Mississauga in 2023 109,011 new homes were created. According to Ontario's own housing tracker, including 9835 Long Term Care home beds already counted in the annual tally. The province reached 99% of its goal last year. However, critics and opposition's argued that the original goal was to increase the affordability and availability of homes and student housing does not meet the criteria. The City of Toronto held its annual controlled burn Tuesday at Hyde Park, with specialized crews walking around the park burning dry leaves, twigs and grass. The aim of the burn was to help the park protect the rare black oak Savanna tree, while also reducing invasive plants. The tree species is fire dependent and needed to help stay alive. Officials temporarily closed off sections of the park to allow the smoke to dissipate, but said the weather was perfect for the burn as it was warm, sunny and dry.
